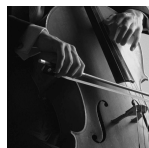

# Strings Class Notes



Classes 34, 35, 36, 37, 40, 44*	One piece or two contrasting pieces should be played. * Ensemble players should bring their own music stands.
Classes 39 & 41	Intended for more advanced players. Two or three pieces should be played, preferably from memory, for which credit will be given.
Classes 38 & 42	All players must be within the age limits, apart from the piano accompanist, if one is used. Ensemble players should bring their own music stands. One or two contrasting pieces should be played.
Class 43a	Intended to encourage adult restarters or beginners to enter. Any standard up to Associated Board Grade 5 (or equivalent).
Class 43b	Designed for adults playing to a standard of Associated Board Grade 5 to 7.
Classes 45a, 45b & 46	All ages. Entrants must play one substantial item, which may be a sonata or concerto movement or a suite and should be a test of musicianship & technique. The winners of these classes ONLY are eligible to enter the Finalists' Competition on the recommendation of the Adjudicator.
Classes 45a and 45b:	Entrants must be at Grade 8 level or above. Please see details on page 15.
